

Gambling is now a multi-billion dollars industry in Canada, and its growth is likely to continue. For some people, gambling becomes a serious problem that affects all aspects of their lives. An association of problem gamblers won a settlement on March 24, 2010 against the video lottery terminals of Lotto-Québec. They split over 50 million between them.1 Video lottery terminals bring in more than a quarter of Lotto-Québec's 3,8 billions in annual revenues. In life you have to take some chances but the odds are usually with you not against you. When you buy a 6/49 ticket your odds to be a winner are 1/13 983 816. You have more chances to get struck by lighting (1/280 000) than to win the lottery.
